Oura Church

The church was designated as a National Treasure in 1933.

Confucian Shrine Koshi Byo

This shrine is very special because it is the world's only Confucian Shrine built outside of mainland China by Chinese hands. You should also visit the Museum of Chinese History and Palace Museum. You will learn a lot!

Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Museum Hypocenter Park & Peace Park



The Museum was built to show the horror of the 1945 atomic bombing of Nagasaki and the need to eliminate all nuclear weapons.

Look out for
The PEACE STATUE

Constructed 1955 by donations from all over the world. The right hand pointing toward the sky warns about the threat of the atomic bomb. The left hand stretching out symbolizes world peace. The gently closed eyes represent a prayer for the souls of all atomic bomb victims.

The Unzen-onsen Hot Spring is divided into three sections: Koyu; Shin-yu; and Sho-jigoku, and is a popular summer resort because of its cool weather. Sulfuric gas colors the ground red and yellow where fumes have burst forth, and more than thirty hot springs are scattered throughout the deserted landscape of Unzen.



It is a site to see and smell!

After lunch!

Visit the Unzen Visitor Center. It has displays

about the most recent eruption of Mount Unzen and its effect on daily life. There is also a lot of information about local plants and wildlife found on the mountain. REMEMBER! Browse the exhibit on hot springs that explains the different types of springs and how they are formed.
